Dear Parishioners,

The weeks of Eastertide roll on and we find ourselves on the Sixth Sunday of Easter and Ascension Thursday occurs during this coming week. The days between Ascension and Pentecost are the original 'novena' remembering the days that the Apostles and Our Lady spent in the upper room praying for the 'power from on high' of the Holy Spirit that Jesus had promised to them.

In this country a number of Christian denominations (including ourselves) run a campaign of prayer at this time of year called 'Thy Kingdom come'. I often get strange looks at Ecumenical gatherings when I refer to this as a 'novena' but it is nice to see the other churches catching up with our well established traditions! In previous years we were able to physically pray together, this year we have to remain physically separated but we can be spiritually united as the Christian people of this country praying for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit at this time of crisis.

I am sure that you have all followed the news throughout the week and you will know that there have been some changes in the 'lockdown' rules and further changes have been suggested to take place in June and July. As the Archbishops said in the letter I printed in the newsletter last week the Catholic Church and the government are talking at a national level about how and when churches can reopen both for private prayer and for public worship. This is likely to be a process that will involve a number of stages and it will require some patience from all of us. However be assured that this work is ongoing. In the meanwhile we can continue to use the many means available to us to keep in touch with one another and above all to remain united in prayer.
