Dear Parishioners,

It is a little while since I shared a few words at the beginning of the newsletter but perhaps this is a good occasion on which to do so.

I am sure you are aware that a number of shops reopened this week and you have perhaps heard on the news that some churches have reopened for private prayer and you may be wondering if this is a possibility for us at St Peter and St Paul. I do have to let you know that the conditions that we would have to meet are very stringent and it is not something that can be done overnight. One of the key requirements is that we have stewards on duty at any time that the church is open and we would need to build up a team of stewards who could not be drawn from any of the 'clinically vulnerable' categories. It would be helpful to know how many people would be willing to volunteer to serve as stewards. If you are not already a parish volunteer you will need to fill in a volunteer registration form. There are also requirements around signage and enhanced cleaning. The Parish Pastoral Council met earlier this week to begin this work and I will keep you updated on our progress. We are conscious that we don't just want to put plans in place for private prayer but also to think about what will be required for the resumption of public worship for which no date has yet been set.

Do please continue praying from home and joining in the Livestreamed Masses as and when you are able to.

I have also put a link on our parish Facebook page to a video showing how St Mary's in Grimsby will be reopening and the new arrangements that will be in place there. When in due course it comes to our turn to reopen we will need to have similar measures in place. We are starting to think about how this might work.

RE-OPENING OF ST HUGH'S: St Hugh's will be open on Saturday mornings between 9am and 12noon. Please note that no toilet facilities will be available.

LIVESTREAMING: Our livestreaming service is up and running, it can be accessed at www.churchservices.tv/lincoln or through the 'web-cam' tab on the parish web-site. Sunday Mass will be at 9am and weekday Mass (Monday-Friday) will usually be at 9.30am although check the newsletter and the on-line schedule for any changes. If you can't make Mass 'live' then a recording will usually be available within an hour of the end of Mass. For the time being Fr Eddy will continue to upload a recording of Mass on the parish YouTube channel as some people find this easier to access and to watch on a TV screen.

Two very generous donations have been received towards the cost of the system. The Coronavirus pandemic will have impacted greatly on many household budgets, but if anyone would like to make a donation towards the cost of the system then please make cheques payable to 'St Peter and St Paul Parish'. Thank you.

PASTORAL VISITS: The latest government rules permit people to meet outdoors as long as they observe social distancing. Fr Eddy is happy to make arrangements to visit parishioners in their gardens for spiritual/pastoral conversations if people would appreciate them. At this stage it is not possible to bring Holy Communion because of the social distancing requirements.

FR VINCENT: We recently celebrated the Feast of the Martyrs of Uganda and hopefully many of our thoughts and prayers turned to Fr Vincent and his apostolic work in that country. It is extremely unlikely that he will be able to come to England this summer. However, we have over £1,000 in the bank which we collected on Wednesday coffee mornings before the lockdown. Fr Eddy proposes to make a bank transfer to Fr Vincent's charity at the end of the month. If anyone would like to add any donations, this is the last week to bring cash to the parish office at a time when Tina is in or else cheques payable to 'St Peter and St Paul Parish a/c' through the post please. Thank you.

OFFERTORY COLLECTIONS DURING THE CORONAVIRUS CRISIS

Parishioners have asked how they can make their offerings during the period our churches are closed. This is much appreciated; our Parish

needs your continued support at this time. Coronavirus has raised some very particular financial challenges for us. Not only do we have no plate and envelope collection but we cannot hire out our parish centre either.

If you currently pay by standing order, this will continue as usual unless you tell your bank to vary it. Of course, we realise that the current emergency is affecting many people's income and they may not be able to continue their level of offerings. If this is the case, we fully understand, so please tell your bank to vary your standing order as appropriate.

If you usually give by envelope or via cash in the collection, you could now donate by Standing Order either by completing a Standing Order form which the parish office can post out to you or else via your online or telephone banking. A Standing Order can be stopped at any time, for example, if you wish to resume giving by cash or envelope once Sunday Mass is resumed, but there are advantages to the parish if people give by Standing Order so please do give this some consideration.

If you wish to set up a standing order or make a one off donation through your online banking please e-mail the parish office. Tina will be able to give you the details of the parish bank account. Please put your name as a payment reference so that we know who the donation is from and can link it up with a gift aid mandate if you have signed one.
