Dear Parishioners,

Please read the following information carefully and further information will also follow next weekend. We are making progress towards being able to resume public worship in our church and I look forward to us being able to gather together again soon.

RE-OPENING FOR MASS: Having received and reviewed the diocesan guidelines on re-opening churches for public worship we aim to resume Masses with a congregation in the week beginning Monday 13 July with the first weekend Masses being on the weekend of 18 and 19 July.

SUNDAY OBLIGATION: A reminder that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended in the dioceses of England and Wales. Therefore please consider carefully if you feel safe and confident to come to the church for Mass. Please remember that people who are clinically vulnerable to Covid19 are still being advised to stay at home as much as possible. If you are able to come on a weekday then please consider making that your weekly Mass for the time being and allow those who work during the week the first opportunity to come to one of the weekend Masses.

BOOKING A PLACE AT MASS: We can only safely accommodate a fixed number of people at Mass and therefore for weekend Masses it will be necessary to book a place in advance. The Diocese is setting up an online booking system (www.massbooking.uk) and we as a parish will be using it. It is hoped that the system will be live from the middle part of next week. If you are unable to access the internet please ring Tina during the hours that she is in the parish office (682278) and she will book a place for you. Booking for the weekend of 18/19 July will begin from Monday 13 July. Once the maximum number of places is reached no further bookings will be taken. Not everyone will be able to get to a weekend Mass every week so if you are fortunate enough to be allocated a place one week please hold back the following week and allow others to have a chance.

STEWARDSHIP AND WELCOMING: If you have a place reserved for a weekend Mass then please arrive at the church in good time. A steward will check that you are on the list for that Mass and will then direct you to a seat. Not every seat will be available at every Mass so you may not be able to sit in your usual seat but please follow the guidance of the stewards. When you reach your seat you will find that the kneelers are in the upright position. Please leave them like this throughout the Mass. At the points when we usually kneel the congregation will be invited to sit. The stewards will also direct you when to come forward to receive Holy Communion. Please note that for the time being Holy Communion will be distributed under one kind and into your hand. If you arrive without a booking you will be asked to wait outside until all those who have booked are seated and you will only be admitted if any spaces remain.

SOCIAL DISTANCING AND FACE-COVERING: We will continue to follow the 2m guideline for social distancing as we can't guarantee that we can make all the necessary mitigations to allow us to reduce to 1m. The use of face coverings is encouraged and if you wish to use one then please bring your own. The stewards will also help the congregation to depart safely after Mass. If you wish to light a candle at the votive candle stands then please be aware of other people around you.

TOILET FACILITIES: The disabled cubicle will be open for emergency use.

REFRESHMENTS AFTER MASS: For the time being there will not be any refreshments after Mass. Please move away promptly from the area around the church door. If you do wish to engage in conversation with other parishioners for example in the car park please remember the guidance around social distancing and groups from different households.

LIVESTREAMING: We intend to continue livestreaming Sunday Masses. The Saturday evening and 9am on Sunday will be livestreamed. The livestream camera will be switched off for the 11am Mass. The camera is focused on the sanctuary area and therefore unless you are involved on the sanctuary at Mass your face will not be seen although possibly your

back may be seen at Holy Communion time. The Sunday 9am Mass will be recorded and remain available on the www.churchservices.tv site for a week before being taken down.

ALTAR SERVERS: We are blessed to have a large number of children serving but it means that social distancing in the sacristy is not possible. Therefore no altar servers will be required at least until the end of the school holidays.

BRIEFING FOR STEWARDS: Thank you to those who have expressed a willingness to be a steward at either weekend or weekday Masses. Can we meet by the front door of the church at 6pm on Thursday 9 July for a briefing to explain what your duties will be. More volunteers are still welcome but please do not volunteer if you are in one of the vulnerable categories. It is essential that stewards do attend this briefing as the parish needs to keep a record of who the stewards are and that they have been briefed on their role.

FUNERALS: Once we receive permission for the church to reopen for public worship we will be able to hold funerals. Government regulation has set a maximum number of 30 people to attend a funeral. Funerals will be listed in the newsletter to encourage people to pray for the deceased and the bereaved but please do not attend unless you have been invited to do so by the family.

CONFESSIONS: Confessions can now be heard but the use of confessionals is to be avoided because of the limited air flow. The safest location may well be outdoors. From Saturday 11 July Father Eddy will be available between 11-11.30am outside the Parish Centre. If anyone would like to celebrate the Sacrament but is unable to attend on a Saturday morning then please contact Fr Eddy to make an alternative arrangement.

PASTORAL VISITS: The latest government rules permit people to meet outdoors as long as they observe social distancing. Fr Eddy is happy to make arrangements to visit parishioners in their gardens for spiritual/pastoral conversations if people would appreciate them. At this stage it is not possible to bring Holy Communion because of the social distancing requirements.
