Lenten thoughts from the Laudato Si Animators ",,,creation can only be understood as a gift from the outstretched hand of the Father of all, and as a reality illuminated by the love which calls us together into universal communion." Laudato Si (LSI) 76

"Lent can foster what is essential at this time: honesty and hope 'Rend your hearts, not your garments' the season begins. We are summoned to be broken open and remain open for forty days. We are invited to look at our beliefs, decisions, and actions and the ways they affect not only our personal lives but the lives of all on this planet. We can allow God to expose the places in our hearts that suffer from the illusion that we are separate and apart – this is the real work of Lent" (Quantum Grace: Lenten Reflections on Creation and Connectedness, Judy Cannato. (American Catholic author, retreat facilitator, and spiritual director who died in 2011).

As we enter Lent during a pandemic which has taken so much away from us, can we open our hearts to see with God's loving eyes what we have been *given*. Can we begin to see creation as a gift from God calling us into universal communion with each other, not universal consumption for ourselves? Can we embrace the true role of humans to take responsibility for all sectors of our common home? Can we become 'servant rulers' operating out of love, compassion and justice for all of creation, instead of squeezing the life out of everything?

"God created man in his own image, in the image of God .... Rule over the fish of the sea and the birds of the air and over every living creature" Genesis 1 v 27,28 (NIV)

Speaking to shepherds, "You have not strengthened the weak or healed the sick or bound up the injured. You have not brought back the strays or searched for the lost. You have ruled them harshly and brutally." Ezekiel 34 v 4-9 (NIV)

"And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God" Micah 6 v 8 (NIV)

God expects His rulers to be different, to be servant rulers who exercise their dominion with love and compassion, working for justice and against oppression.

We can look to the sacrificial life of Jesus to inspire us to sacrifice our overconsumption for a commitment to Live Simply both within our parishes and individually. As we allow our vision to expand, realising we are part of and intrinsically connected with all that God created, we will begin to behave more responsibly.

The LSI Animators strive to "... see God in all that exists" so that "our hearts are moved to praise the Lord for all his creatures and to worship him in union with them. This sentiment finds magnificent expression in the hymn of St Francis of Assisi: Praised be You my Lord with all Your creatures .........." LSI 87
