THE CANON'S COMMENTS - MAINTENANCE OF PARISH PROPERTIES: This past Wednesday started off very well; if a little early, 5am! I had planned my day well, so I thought. I did my usual pottering and domestic jobs and then went over to the church about 8.30am to open and set up for the 9.30am Mass. As I approached the back door of the Church I heard a continuous alarm sound; the fire alarm for the Parish Centre was showing a fault, again. So, I 'phoned the company that services the alarm and arranged for an engineer to attend later that day. Said Mass at 9.30am, a bit more pottering, then went on a sick call to a Parishioner, then off to do some shopping. When I got back there was a missed call. Since Monday of this past week there has been an electrician checking the electrics of all our properties; as is required under law - the five-yearly check. message was to contact him asap, there was a problem. I spoke with the electrician and he told me he had had to contact our power supplier as a matter of urgency. The reason being the cables that feed the Church and 2a had been damaged and was causing a serious problem with the electrics, not only in 2a, but also the church and parish centre. Within four hours the engineers arrived, i.e., 3.30pm. Their initial reaction was "Oh we weren't expecting anything like this!". In the meantime, following yet another thunderstorm and heavy downfall of rain the drains and gutters around the church began to overflow. Finally, the engineer for the Fire Alarm arrived and after checking the Control Panel told me we needed a new one. At the time of writing, 8.20pm on Wednesday evening, the engineers from Western Power are still on site, I am awaiting a report from them, a quotation for a replacement for a new Control Panel for the Fire Alarm and a quotation for cleaning and rodding all the drains and gutters around our properties. I hope you would all agree that maintenance and care of our properties be they Domestic or Parish is important. Sincerely, Canon Geoffrey

I recently read of a local bishop who is taking seriously ill priests to hospital, due to the fact there is a shortage of ambulances and no guarantee that a hospital bed can even be found. It was devastating to learn that the Diocese of Dumka has lost five priests to COVID-19 in the space of 10 days. May God grant them and all those who have lost their lives, eternal rest and may our Blessed Mother comfort the sick and the dying in this time of terrible trial and sorrow."

LOOKING AHEAD: 21st June, please God will see further relaxations of Corona Virus restrictions. 29th June is our Patronal Feast Day, and I am more than hoping that the weekend before after the 11am Mass on the Sunday, i.e. 27th June we will be able to gather together, complying with any remaining restrictions to celebrate and give thanks to God and enjoy each other's company in the Parish grounds – please put this in your diaries and watch this space! **Canon Geoffrey**
