LENTEN INITIATIVES: The Season of Lent will soon be upon us, Ash Wednesday this year falls on 2 March. Apart from the four initiatives listed below as Lenten Exercises may I encourage you to support two further initiatives suggested to me by Parishioners. Lent is a time of prayer, reconciliation, fasting and almsgiving, it has been suggested that we as a parish support ourselves and a charity by praying daily for our parish and parishioners, and PACT, The Prisoners Advice Care Trust, linked with this is that we all give up something for the forty days of Lent, e.g., a drink, chocolates, biscuits, etc., and over the forty of days of Lent donate forty pence a day to be shared equally between PACT and Parish Funds. The second initiative is for forty hours of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament spread over 2 hours per day spread over 20 days. Envelopes for the Parish/PACT idea and a sign-up sheet for the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be made available from this weekend.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: Stations of the Cross during Lent will be celebrated each Friday evening at 6.30pm

One box for the recycling of Toothpaste Tubes and Toothbrushes, a great addition to the recycling activities of the Parish, and the other is for recycling used Ink Cartridges for Mary's

Meals. It is surprising how tiny amounts add up but in a short space of time £2,500 has been raised from Ink Cartridges which is enough to feed at least 160 children for a year! It's a win, win situation with less plastic about and more children fed!

STAMPS FOR MEDICAL DETECTION DOGS: Many thanks for the many stamps donated this year. The response has been great, and the stamps so well trimmed there has been little wastage. I wondered if any of your children had had new Backpacks for Christmas and if so and you do not need to pass the old ones on to family or friends, would you be kind enough to give them to Mary's Meals Backpack project? Second-hand backpacks are very acceptable and will bring great joy to children who have nothing. Mary's Meals have just had permission to begin serving 4,000 meals a day to the children in **The Yemen**, it will transform their chances in life.

STUDENT CROSS 2022: Do you want to do something different for Holy Week? Why not join the Pilgrim Cross Walking Pilgrimage to Walsingham? held over Holy Week from various destinations in the country.
