**Works on 2a are concluding. There are still several items to be completed which I am hoping will be attended to by the beginning of June. The most important of these is the metal gates. The Diocese will decide as to when 240 BPR is marketed over the coming month or so. The funds raised from the sale will go some way towards paying for the works undertaken at 2a. At the time of writing, I do not know the full cost of the reconfiguring and refurbishing of 2a, however, may I remind all that the sale of 240 BPR will not cover the works undertaken and there will be a significant shortfall which means the Parish will be in debt to the Diocese for the foreseeable future. I am now making the slow move from 240 BPR to 2a, this will take two to three weeks or so, please bear with me and Tina during this time – thank you! CG**
