**Sunday Morning Coffee Rota:** The new coffee morning rota is up in the Lady Chapel. It is very empty!! This rota covers all Sundays up to the end of November, please do consider running a coffee morning after 9am, 11am or both Masses to raise funds for our Parish. Thank you.

Parish Centre: Those involved with the upkeep of the kitchen are concerned that people using the Centre are leaving opened packets of biscuits, cakes, milk, juice etc in the cupboards and the fridge. Please note if booking the Centre for a coffee morning, you must bring in fresh produce on the day and take anything left over with you when the event finishes. Please do not leave behind any items in the cupboards and the fridge for another group or day!

Community Grocery – helping the people of Lincoln with their weekly shop! Did you know that anyone may join the Community Grocery initiative, through an annual membership of £5? After that it is only £4 per shop, with up to 5 shops per week (one shop per day, Monday-Friday 9.30am-4.30pm). The Community Grocery is in partnership with Acts Trust, Alive Church, and is located at the top of Beaumont Fee (Beaumont Manor), LN1 1UL.

Hospital Admission: Just a gentle reminder that if you, or a member of your family are admitted to hospital, the parish clergy are not automatically informed. If you wish to receive visits from a chaplain and/or receive any of the sacraments whilst in hospital, please let us know. Alternatively ask a member of the ward staff to contact the hospital chaplaincy team and they will arrange it. The chaplaincy team also hold the rota of priests available for administering the Sacrament of the Sick in emergencies at night.

Safeguarding Training: The CSSA (Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency) is to shortly launch an online training portal which will allow all parish volunteers the opportunity to learn more about safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults and creating a safer environment for church activities. The Diocese requires all volunteers with DBS clearance to undertake this training as part of their role within the parish. It can be done at a convenient time to suit the individual. Certificates of completion are available. Volunteers that do not require DBS clearance for their role do not have to complete the training but are encouraged and recommended to do so. The costs are being met from outside donations, so this is completely free, but if anyone would like to help us at a future date, we would welcome your support.

**Mission to Seamen - Apostleship of the Sea:** This year as the teams in Grimsby still have no access to the Ships! they are collecting **Woolly Hats and all things Chocolate.** Our parish always supports the Seamen, and we will be collecting during the four weekends of August – 5/6, 12/13, 19/20 and 26/27. Please be as generous as you can be because these Seamen bring in 93% of

all we consume in England and are usually low paid and work long stretches without going home to see their families. Thank you.

Catholic Outreach Lincoln - Our Lady of Lincoln, St. Peter & St. Paul and St. Hugh of Lincoln - Three churches speaking with one voice. Catholic Outreach Lincoln is the Lincoln branch of Caritas in the Diocese of Nottingham, taking inspiration from the Gospel of Matthew (5:14-16) "You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. No one, after lighting a lamp, puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." We have formed a small, co-ordinating group, with representatives from all three parishes in Lincoln under the leadership of Deacon Warren Peachey and Paul Bodenham, Programme Leader for Social Action in the diocese of Nottingham. Other members are Karen and Adrian Jones, Councillor Chris Burke, Patricia and Brian Davis, Martin Cook, Perry Fox, Mary and Deacon John Wilford. Please approach any of us for further information. We aim to co-ordinate social outreach across the City of Lincoln and the surrounding area, working with Transform Lincoln, Churches Together and inter-faith groups. The first open meeting will take place on 3rd August at 7pm at Our Lady of Lincoln.

At this time we remember the devastation caused in Hiroshima and Nagasaki when the atomic bombs were dropped, on 6th and 9th August 1945 and we pray that nuclear weapons will be abolished so that they can never be used again. In his message, 'A Culture of Care as a Path to Peace', Pope Francis asks, 'How many resources are spent on weaponry, especially nuclear weapons, that could be used for more significant priorities such as ensuring the safety of individuals, the promotion of peace and integral human development, the fight against poverty, and the provision of health care'. In this country we have an active Catholic peace movement in Pax Christi.
