PARISH FINANCES

Firstly, my sincere thanks on behalf of the Parish to all who contribute to the weekly offertory collection, either through the collecting plate or via a Standing Order. Likewise, sincere thanks to those who work so hard to raise vital funds through a variety of ways – Teas and Coffees on Sunday and Wednesday mornings, Friday Lunches, the weekly Parish Draw, Christmas Fayre, etc. As you are aware the Parish is in debt to the Diocese as a result of the works undertaken at 2a Skellingthorpe Road. The Parish Debt initially stood at £147,005.29 however, following donations and a generous legacy this has now been reduced to £129,588.76. However, I have received the Quinquennial Report for the Parish Properties, i.e., The Church, The Parish Centre and The Presbytery, which identified £2,200 worth of immediate works to be actioned. Furthermore, in the near future we will have to pay the retention to the main contractor for the works at 2a Skellingthorpe Road which will increase the debt further. I have agreed with the Diocese that initially we will pay back £500 per month and when possible will make additional payments. If we were only to pay the £500 per month, the debt would not be paid off for 25 years. May I request all who worship here or join us via The Livestream to consider seriously how the debt can be reduced sooner, rather than later. Obviously if anybody would like to donate towards the reduction of the debt, please do speak to me. As mentioned a few weeks back, the easiest and most efficient way the debt could be reduced is for all UK taxpayers to sign up for Gift Aid and make their contribution either via Standing Order or make use of the Planned Giving Envelope scheme. A reminder if you contribute for example £5 per week in the loose plate, BUT if you were to sign up for Gift Aid your contribution would rise to £6.25 per week at no extra cost to you. May I ask all taxpayers to consider this, it would greatly help your Parish. Gift Aid Forms and Standing Order Forms may be found in the Lady Chapel or above the Hymn Books, or if you wish to sign up for Gift Aid Envelopes there is a sheet on the table adjacent to the Repository Table. Thank you, Canon Geoffrey.
